Mission

The Mustang Fund, Inc. is a not-for-profit fundraising organization supporting Montgomery Elementary School's (MES) pursuit of excellence in education. Our focus is supporting curriculum enhancements for the school by enriching the learning environment in every classroom for every student. We rely upon individual contributions, corporate donations, and community fundraising events to achieve our mission. Through the Mustang Fund, parents, teachers, neighbors, businesses, administrators, and staff work together toward a common goal: **excellence in public education**.

Vision

The ultimate goal of the Mustang Fund will ensure that Montgomery continues to be a sought after public elementary school. Specifically our vision is to ensure that the fund actively:

- Enhances the experience of every MES student
- Enriches faculty, programming, and equipment within the four walls of MES
- Actively assists in preparing our student body for success in their secondary school
- Gives back to students, parents, faculty, local businesses, and private citizens as a vital part of our community
- Ultimately, assists in ensuring that our Montgomery community remains a sought after community in the Atlanta area

Establishment

• The Mustang Fund was established as an official entity on September 9, 2010 and achieved 501(c)(3) status on February 13, 2012.

2015-2016 Review

- The Mustang Fund looked long and hard at the exterior of our campus and determined our upper grades'
 playground to be not only inadequate but unsafe. We developed a plan for a new playground that would
 include a goal of \$50,000 generated from our annual appeal.
- The Mustang Fund reached 75% of our goal from our Montgomery family. With additional fundraising initiatives we raised a total of \$111,673.38 in donations during the 2015-2016 academic year.



- The Mustang Fund remains committed to supporting Montgomery's STEM Certification efforts. We continue to fund opportunities for student learning, support faculty training efforts in STEM curriculum, and provide support for technology integration within classrooms and the STEM lab.
- The Mustang Fund's balance as of June 30, 2015 was \$258,012.42.

2015-2016 Board Actions and Results

Fundraising

- The foundation began fundraising efforts with a Back to School Spirit event at Town Brookhaven, generating \$503.61.
- The foundation once again conducted an annual appeal to the MES community, generating \$33,216.52 through donations among family, friends and corporate matches.
- Contributors were acknowledged through personalized letters and listed on website/newsletters and are also featured in this annual report.
- Through a concentrated effort on fundraising within our community, the Mustang Fund continued to build the business partner program and raised \$10,708.25 from local businesses.
- The foundation continued to build our partnership with Ed Voyles through the Chamblee Cluster Schools Car Raffle. The second annual raffle generated \$5,245 in additional funds.
- As a result of another strong fundraising year, the Montgomery PTA was able to contribute \$62,000 to the Mustang Fund. \$22,000 of this donation was designated to adding the basketball court to our new playground.

Expenses

- The biggest area of contribution was the installation of our new playground and basketball court.
- Teacher training and professional development continues to be an area of focus. \$9,285.56 was invested in our teachers which directly impacts our children every day.
- In addition, we continue work on branding MES as a STEM school. \$3,500 was invested in STEM support and training.
- The Teacher Grant program started in 2012 continues to support our teachers. \$904.20 was awarded to teachers for classroom use.
- Being engaged in our community continues to be a focus with \$757.50 being spent engaging community members for school programs.
- \$5,203.28 was spent on ongoing operations including insurance and marketing expenses.

• The Mustang Fund, Inc. continues to work with a committee of teachers and administrators to meet the objectives necessary for STEM certification.
